### LARC

- **Description of work:** This once a month walk in clinic is open to the public with the purpose of assisting individuals with legal questions and concerns. First time volunteers conduct intake to determine the legal assistance sought and so the person can be matched with an attorney who practices in that area. Second and third year students who have volunteered previously assist with document production (demand letters, answers, administrative complaints, etc.) under direction of the attorneys. Students who are fluent in Spanish, Cantonese, or Mandarin are especially needed. Training is provided the day of the event.
- **Skill Level:** All, interpreters especially needed.
- **Time Commitment:** Saturday, December 16<sup>th</sup>, 2017, from 9:45am – 2:30pm.

### Fresh Lifelines for Youth (FLY) – Teaching at-risk youth about laws and their rights.

- **Description of work:** This is a great opportunity for anyone interested in law, youth development, education, or simply anyone enthusiastic about giving back to young people. FLY's nationally recognized law curriculum uses role-plays, debates, and mock city council hearings to capture youth interest, educate them about the law, and build skills like anger management, problem solving, communication, and resisting negative peer pressure. Highly trained volunteers and FLY staff teach the course in teams of 3-4, developing rapport with youth and giving them access to positive role models. The 12-week course covers a range of topics, including theft, vandalism, hate crimes, drugs and alcohol, the Three-Strikes Law, Proposition 21, and gangs.
- **Skill Level:** Any. **No prior teaching experience is required!**
- **Time Commitment:** FLY requires all volunteers commit to teach for a semester (12 weeks), typically 2 hours, once a week, at one of our Alameda County sites. Our sites range from during the school day to after school, and we always place students at sites that align with their schedule. Students will also complete 36 hours of training, which can be counted as a part of pro bono hours. The commitment totals around 90 hours per semester, and is perfect for all law students.

### Addressing Sexual Harassment in the Legal Industry

## Tuesday, November 14 | 3:30-4:30pm | Classroom K

Join UC Hastings Distinguished Professor Joan C. Williams and her seasoned colleagues for a timely panel discussion on sexual harassment in the legal industry. Panelists will review the legal framework of sexual harassment and discuss whether the recent Harvey Weinstein scandal — a tipping point in the entertainment industry — has parallels in the legal profession. Panelists will provide practical tools on how to address sexism/sexual harassment when it is directed towards you or others, including how to be an ally. The panel will conclude with an open Q&A session. Be the first to ask Professor Williams about her Ted Talk last weekend!

### Panelists:

Distinguished Professor Joan C. Williams has been described in The New York Times Magazine as having “something approaching rock star status” in her field. She has authored 11 books and over ninety academic articles. Her work has been covered everywhere from Oprah Magazine to The Atlantic and Slate to Fox News.

Her 2014 book (co-written with her daughter Rachel Dempsey) *What Works For Women at Work* was praised by The New York Times Book Review: “Deftly combining sociological research with a more casual narrative style, *What Works for Women at Work* offers unabashedly straightforward advice in a how-to primer for ambitious women.” Following its success, Sheryl Sandberg and [LeanIn.org](https://leanin.org) asked Joan to create short videos sharing the strategies discussed in the book. The videos have been downloaded over 975,000 times and are featured by Virgin Airlines as in-flight entertainment, seen literally around the world.

Louise Francis, a Hastings graduate, is Director of the Alumni Mentor Program with the UC Hastings Career Development Office and has coached UC Hastings students and alumni on career development issues since 2007. Louise practiced as a commercial litigator for over 15 years at two large firms -- Sheppard Mullin and Heller Ehrman. She tried cases in federal and state court and argued appeals, including an appeal before the Ninth Circuit. As a partner at Heller Ehrman, she was the Managing Partner of the San Francisco headquarter office from 1997 to 2000, managing over 300 people. As Managing Partner she took an active role in lawyer reviews and lawyer and staff grievances.

Geri Lynn Green is a Hastings graduate who has spent three decades specializing in criminal and civil rights, litigation, in federal and state courts at both trial and appellate levels. She has represented incarcerated women who were subjected to sexual abuse, which led her to work with the United Nations to investigate and report on the torture of women in American prisons. She has been mediating and facilitating disputes since 2013 and recently assumed the position of Board President to Community Boards, a San Francisco legacy non-profit providing low-cost mediation, dispute resolution and facilitation to San Francisco businesses and residents.
