Live Scan Fingerprinting will be available on campus on Tuesday, November 15 and Wednesday, November 16. Students can sign up for a 10 minute appointment here: <http://bit.ly/UCHfingerprinting> The fee for Live Scan Fingerprinting is \$25 – please bring cash or a check. You also need a government issued ID. Fingerprints are valid for 90 days, so students should submit their moral character applications within 90 days of being fingerprinted.

Spring 2017 Experiential Opportunities – Clinics and Externships

As you start to plan to register in mid-November for Spring 2017 classes, consider our renowned clinics and externship programs, where you can earn academic credit while gaining lawyering experience under the supervision of full-time clinical faculty, practicing attorneys, or judges committed to your professional development.

- In most clinics, students take lead responsibility for representing real clients from start-to-finish under the supervision of Hastings clinical faculty, who select appropriate cases and provide support and detailed feedback. An accompanying academic course integrates training in relevant substantive law and the skills (e.g., interviewing, counseling, fact development, negotiating, etc.) in which students will engage, as well as grounded discussions that help students reflect on their fieldwork and role as lawyers.
- In externships (also known as field placements), students work on assignments in bustling, real-world government agencies and non-profit law offices under the supervision of attorneys who supervise and provide feedback on students' work. A linked academic course, taught by Hastings faculty, encourages students to reflect on what they are learning from their fieldwork assignments and how to work most effectively with their site supervisors.

Interested in health law, estate planning, direct client representation, public interest, or small firm practice? Or just not sure what you want to do? Get practical legal training in transactional areas of law!

In the **Medical-Legal Partnership for Seniors clinic (MLPS)**, law students tackle legal issues affecting the health of older adults in collaboration with medical providers. Law students handle cases of UCSF and VA patients from start to finish in areas of advance health care planning, estate planning, public benefits, and other legal matters as needed to stabilize that person's situation and improve overall health. Law students meet with patients on-site at a medical clinic and in their homes. No prerequisites or prior experience required.

The clinic uses rolling admission, however, applications submitted by Nov. 11 at Noon will receive priority consideration. Tip! WebAdvisor will provide you a list of titles, authors, and ISBN (standard numbers) for each book. Always check the ISBN number before you purchase a book. While the author and title may stay the same, each edition of a casebook will have a different ISBN number. Older editions of casebooks tend to be cheaper, but new editions of casebooks tend to include revised legal principles and updated footnotes.

Tip! Remember to check your syllabus, as sometimes you really don't need the whole book, but rather only a few chapters or a portion of the book.

- [Legal Advice and Referral Clinic \(LARC\)](#) is seeking volunteers for **Saturday, December 17th, from 9:45-2:30**. LARC, is a tremendous opportunity to interact directly with clients, improve your interviewing skills, and work with lawyers across a broad spectrum of practice areas. LARC is held one Saturday a month at UCH and typically serves 100-150

community members with a wide array of legal issues. We have volunteer attorneys who are experts in criminal, immigration, housing, real estate, probate, family, employment, personal injury, consumer, and other areas of law. Student volunteers conduct intake interviews to help determine which lawyer a person needs to consult. Volunteers are asked to commit from 9:45-2:30 on the Saturday they volunteer. Second and third year students who have volunteered previously assist with document production (demand letters, answers, administrative complaints, etc.) under the direction of the attorneys. Training is provided the day of the event. We always need students who are fluent in **Spanish, Mandarin, and Cantonese**.

The FBA is looking for student volunteers to interview clients, review applications, inform veterans of their eligibility, and other informative counseling. This is the official statewide resource for self-help referrals and information and LiveChat volunteers help people navigate the website by providing direct, person-to-person help for someone who might be in a stressful and alienating legal situation who just needs a kind, human response. This is a great opportunity for anyone who is interested in direct services, broadening access to justice, and community education. Students can gain pro bono hours and learn about tools for social justice in many topics. It is possible to work remotely from a personal computer, though the first few training/practice sessions take place in LAAC's Oakland office until you are comfortable navigating the website. This opportunity is open to 1L, 2L, or 3L volunteers. - [Justice & Diversity Center's Consumer Debt Defense and Education Clinic](#) is a monthly clinic held two Wednesday evenings a month from 6-9pm. Volunteers assist attorneys with drafting cease and desist letters to creditors, answers, fee waiver applications, responses to discovery, motions for summary judgement, demands for bills of particulars, claims of exemption, proposed orders and proof of services. Volunteers also perform legal research on-site as needed to help manage the clinic and communications with clients. Volunteers will be likely to sit in on client consultations and as the clinic develops, volunteers may be able to attend hearings and/or trials with attorneys. All volunteers must attend a 1-hour training session prior to volunteering. **For information about the next training, please email probono@sfbbar.org.**
- [Tenants Together](#), California's only statewide organization for renters' rights, is putting out a call for volunteers. In November of this year, five cities in the wider Bay Area will be voting on comprehensive rent control measures, and hopefully they will win. Volunteers will do work varying from supporting/defending legal challenges on rent control, helping prepare educational materials to train tenant lawyers on the new ordinances, compiling know-your-rights info sheets for affected tenants, and doing legal research. As we have seen in SF and Oakland (amongst many other cities), the appalling impacts of displacement more intensely affect people of color and low-income communities. In short, legal volunteers are key in the fight against gentrification and displacement. Volunteers are expected to commit to at least 5 hours per week.
