Client Counseling Competition/Hastings Client Counseling Team

UC Hastings has an award winning Client Counseling Team that competes each year in the ABA Law Student Division Client Counseling Competition. Students learn to interview and counsel clients, learn an area of substantive law, and compete against other law students from across the country.

The ABA Law Student Division Client Counseling Competition simulates a law office consultation in which law students, acting as attorneys, are presented with a client matter. They conduct an interview with a person playing the role of the client and then explain how they would proceed further in the hypothetical situation.

A team consists of two JD candidates attending the same ABA- approved law school who conduct an interview with a person playing the role of the client. This includes eliciting facts, advising about the relevant law, providing options for proceeding, and assisting the client to make an informed choice.

The regional competition consists of three qualifying rounds with each team competing indirectly against two other teams in each round. The teams are presented with a different client matter in each round. After the qualifying rounds, the top six teams advance to the semifinal round, culminating with the three winning teams in a final round.

The first place team from each regional competition will advance to the National Finals. Teams can be made up of any combination of 2L's and 3L's.

***Autumn Reflections* by Rachel Goodman November, 2015**

The fall conjures up more memories than any other season for me. Maybe because as an East Coast transplant to the Bay Area, I originally thought we didn't have the fall here, and was pleasantly surprised to discover that when you look closely you can find this subtle and gorgeous season.

Here are some of my reflections:

In the fall of 2003, back when laptops were pretty heavy, coffee was not yet a hipster thing, and cell phones were only just starting to come into vogue, I had recently arrived at UC Hastings, wide eyed. My office was in the Tower then, kitty corner from the then Scientology building.

I remember the rush of new students as the semester was getting underway, the pumpkin ice cream at the Halloween party where Mike Stonebreaker was dressed as a cow, and squinting while getting my picture taken in front of the sunny 198 building sign for then UC Hastings paper newsletter.

After filling out many forms in triplicate, I was welcomed into this multicultural bustling UC Hastings community that reminded me so much of my childhood home: New York City. It was familiar to me to debate with fast-talking fiery academics of every political persuasion (the professors and the students), and to work closely with immigrants from all over the world. There were so many fascinating people around, some of whom were similar to me and many of whom were entirely different from me. I met fellow alumni from Oberlin College, other New York Jews, and people whose calm Hawaiian presence inspired me to save up and one day travel to Hawaii. I learned about Bollywood here, and I was first exposed to boba drinks, (long before they were popular), and I would look forward to Teresa's call that she was getting some for folks in Fiscal and did I want one too. I felt cared for.

It is the unique combination of warmth, community, humor, cultural celebration and intellectual rigor of this place that is so very inviting and has kept me coming back for more all these years. There are kindred spirits here, many of whom have become life-long friends. In the intervening years I have grown and changed, and so has UC Hastings, but it is something about this liminal season of persimmons and hot apple cider that brings me back to that time 12 years ago when I first arrived on your Beach.

HRPLJ Presents “Judging and Daring to be Fair”

Thursday, November 19th, 6pm-9pm, Skyroom

A discussion with recently-retired Judge David Matthew Krashna who served as a judicial officer with the Alameda County courts for over 23 years. Judge Krashna will speak as to his life, serving as the first and still only Black student body president at the University of Notre Dame, growing up in the heyday of the Civil Rights movement, and the path that led him to a career in the judiciary - recounting potholes and scenic routes. Judge Krashna will also be promoting his new book, Black Domers: Seventy Years at Notre Dame, which chronicles the experiences of Black alumni and students at the University of Notre Dame.

Hastings and HRPLJ alum S. C. Thomas, '12, a graduate of the Capitol Fellows program and a mediator of civil rights disputes, will moderate the discussion and engage Judge Krashna in a dialogue on the benefits of a career in state government, navigating the state judiciary, and advise students on how to pursue entry level career opportunities in the public sector. The discussion will also focus on the importance of social justice lawyering and current efforts at increasing diversity in legal education, the bar and the bench.
