Older editions of casebooks tend to be cheaper, but new editions of casebooks tend to include revised legal principles and updated footnotes.

Tip! Remember to check your syllabus, as sometimes you really don't need the whole book, but rather only a few chapters or a portion of the book.

Please join the Center for Gender & Refugee Studies (CGRS) and the Network in Solidarity with the People of Guatemala (NISGUA) for an evening with Ms. Maudi Tzay, a Guatemalan psychologist with the Community Studies and Psycho-Social Action Team, a well-known Guatemalan mental health organization that provides healing accompaniment to survivors of violence. Ms. Tzay will present on her role as a psychologist within an alliance of plaintiff organizations (Alliance for Breaking the Silence and Ending Impunity) in the historic [Sepur Zarco trial](#) in which former military personnel were successfully convicted of crimes against humanity for rape, sexual slavery, and domestic slavery of indigenous women in Guatemala's internal armed conflict.

CGRS Director and UC Hastings Law Professor Karen Musalo will also present on the historic importance of the Sepur Zarco case, addressing the brutality and genocide that occurred during the 36-year armed conflict and the Guatemalan military regime's use of violence against women as a war strategy. The impact of this gender-based violence continues in Guatemala to this day, forcing women and children to flee for their lives and seek asylum in the United States. CGRS has a long-standing commitment of documenting and combating gender-based violence in Guatemala and Central America, building partnerships with human rights advocates in the region, and defending the right to asylum in the United States for women and children fleeing this violence. We are honored to be joined by Ms. Tzay as we celebrate the historic Sepur Zarco victory and continue to fight against present-day impunity enjoyed by perpetrators of crimes against women.
