Disability Resource (DRP) Program Deadlines

Do you have a documented disability and need accommodations? Are you receiving treatment for or in the process of getting diagnosed with a possible disability, whether that disability is visible or non-apparent (sometimes called “hidden” or “invisible” disabilities?) **DON'T WAIT TO CONTACT DRP TO REQUEST ACCOMMODATIONS!** By law and to ensure the integrity of the program, registering with the Disability Resource Program (DRP) to determine eligibility and accommodations must be an interactive, deliberative and collaborative process. At a minimum, this includes (1) providing sufficient, relevant documentation for review, and (2) meeting with the Director for a comprehensive eligibility and access planning meeting (a.k.a., an intake.) It is not meant to be an onerous process, but IT TAKES TIME. Therefore:

- If you are ONLY requesting accommodations for **final exams**, the deadline for **COMPLETING your registration with DRP** to consider accommodations for final exams only is **FRIDAY, OCTOBER 27, 2017**. However, **if you haven't begun the process well in advance of that date, you may be too late to receive accommodations for final exams**. Spring 2018 Experiential Opportunities – Clinics and Externships

As you plan to register in mid-November for Spring 2018 classes, consider our renowned clinics and externship programs, where you can earn academic credit while gaining lawyering experience under the supervision of full-time clinical faculty, practicing attorneys, or judges committed to your professional development.

- In most clinics, students take lead responsibility for representing real clients from start-to-finish under the supervision of experienced Hastings clinical faculty, who select appropriate cases and provide support and detailed feedback. An accompanying academic course integrates training in relevant substantive law and the skills (e.g., interviewing, counseling, fact development, negotiating, etc.) in which students will engage, as well as grounded discussions that help students reflect on their fieldwork and role as lawyers.
- In externships (also known as field placements), students work on assignments in bustling, real-world government agencies and non-profit law offices under the supervision of attorneys who supervise and provide feedback on students' work. A linked academic course, taught by Hastings faculty, encourages students to reflect on what they are learning from their fieldwork assignments and how to work most effectively with their site supervisors.

Day at Law School

- **Description of work:** DALs is an all-day event coordinated by UC Hastings La Raza in which we invite K-12 youth from the Bay Area to come and experience a Day at Law School. This event aims to empower underrepresented youth to pursue law school and a career in the legal field. Volunteers typically help serve on student panels, lead student tours around the school, present know your rights material, coach students for a mock trial, and other logistical tasks such as registering attendees, making phone calls during phone banks, creating student resource folders and keep time for each one of the sessions throughout the day.
- **Skill Level:** All
