### Spring 2017 Experiential Opportunities – Clinics and Externships

As you start to plan to register in mid-November for Spring 2017 classes, consider our renowned clinics and externship programs, where you can earn academic credit while gaining lawyering experience under the supervision of full-time clinical faculty, practicing attorneys, or judges committed to your professional development.

- In most clinics, students take lead responsibility for representing real clients from start-to-finish under the supervision of Hastings clinical faculty, who select appropriate cases and provide support and detailed feedback. An accompanying academic course integrates training in relevant substantive law and the skills (e.g., interviewing, counseling, fact development, negotiating, etc.) in which students will engage, as well as grounded discussions that help students reflect on their fieldwork and role as lawyers.

- In externships (also known as field placements), students work on assignments in bustling, real-world government agencies and non-profit law offices under the supervision of attorneys who supervise and provide feedback on students' work. A linked academic course, taught by Hastings faculty, encourages students to reflect on what they are learning from their fieldwork assignments and how to work most effectively with their site supervisors.

Interested in health law, estate planning, direct client representation, public interest, or small firm practice? Or just not sure what you want to do? Get practical legal training in transactional areas of law!

In the **Medical-Legal Partnership for Seniors clinic (MLPS)**, law students tackle legal issues affecting the health of older adults in collaboration with medical providers. Law students handle cases of UCSF and VA patients from start to finish in areas of advance health care planning, estate planning, public benefits, and other legal matters as needed to stabilize that person's situation and improve overall health. Law students meet with patients on-site at a medical clinic and in their homes. No prerequisites or prior experience required.

The clinic uses rolling admission, however, applications submitted by Nov. 11 at Noon will receive priority consideration. **Tip!** WebAdvisor will provide you a list of titles, authors, and ISBN (standard numbers) for each book. Always check the ISBN number before you purchase a book. While the author and title may stay the same, each edition of a casebook will have a different ISBN number. Older editions of casebooks tend to be cheaper, but new editions of casebooks tend to include revised legal principles and updated footnotes.

**Tip!** Remember to check your syllabus, as sometimes you really don't need the whole book, but rather only a few chapters or a portion of the book.


