As you may know, El Capitan (OSX 10.11) was released to the public on September 30th by Apple. **At this time, ExamSoft/SofTest is unable to announce official compatibility** due to a vulnerability identified during the testing. ExamSoft is working on resolving this vulnerability, however they will be preventing students from downloading or registering SofTest on a device with El Capitan until this issue is addressed.

San Francisco Immigrant Legal Defense Collaborative (SFILDC) is looking for students to help with projects!

In 2014, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors funded a ground-breaking collaborative of 13 organizations – known together as the San Francisco Immigrant Legal Defense Collaborative (SFILDC) -- to protect the due process rights of recent women and children who came to the US to escape violence in Central America and have been put in expedited removal proceedings before the San Francisco Immigration Court. The SFILDC hopes that law students can help with a number of important projects. Many of these opportunities can be tailored to your interest and availability, and the SFILDC will provide any needed training and support. Spanish fluency may be required for some of these projects. These projects include: (1) Interpreting for families and children at the Asylum Office and other USCIS interviews; (2) Preparing and reviewing declarations and applications with families/children; (3) Conducting Know Your Rights presentations at the SF Immigration Court; (4) Assisting with Attorney of the Day services at the SF Immigration Court; and (5) Assisting with legal pleadings and research, creating pro se materials, and other assistance. Flu season is almost here. Per CDC recommendations, everyone 6 months of age and older should receive annual influenza vaccination. It takes about two weeks after vaccination for your body to develop an immune response. Get vaccinated now so that you will be protected when flu season begins. In the United States, influenza season usually begins in October and can last until May.

Disability Resource Program Announcements!

Do you have a documented disability and need accommodations? Are you receiving treatment for or in the process of getting diagnosed with a possible disability, whether that disability is visible or non-apparent (sometimes called "hidden" or "invisible" disabilities?) DON'T WAIT TO CONTACT DRP TO REQUEST ACCOMMODATIONS! By law and to ensure the integrity of the program, registering with DRP to determine eligibility and accommodations must be an interactive, deliberative and collaborative process. At a minimum, this includes (1) providing sufficient, relevant documentation for review, and (2) meeting with the Director for a comprehensive eligibility and access planning meeting (a.k.a., an intake meeting.) It is not meant to be an onerous process, but **IT TAKES TIME**. Therefore, students are urged to **contact DRP at DRP@uchastings.edu or 415-581-8948** at the very beginning of the semester to initiate this process and for timely consideration of classroom-based accommodations. **Students are advised to [schedule an intake appointment to occur no later than FRIDAY, OCTOBER 2, 2015](#)**. Accommodations are not granted retroactively, so **earlier is better!** The deadline for **completing** your registration with DRP to consider accommodations for final exams is **WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 4, 2015**. **However, if you haven't begun the process well in advance of that date, you may be too late to receive accommodations for final exams**. Are you concerned that you might have a disability, but do not have current or sufficient documentation?

If you have UC SHIP, your first step is to contact [Student Health Services](#) (SHS) for an evaluation and possible recommendation for further assessment.
