Disability Resource Program Deadlines!

Do you have a documented disability and need accommodations? Are you receiving treatment for or in the process of getting diagnosed with a possible disability, whether that disability is visible or non-apparent (sometimes called “hidden” or “invisible” disabilities?) **DON'T WAIT TO CONTACT DRP TO REQUEST ACCOMMODATIONS!** By law and to ensure the integrity of the program, registering with the Disability Resource Program (DRP) to determine eligibility and accommodations must be an interactive, deliberative and collaborative process. At a minimum, this includes (1) providing sufficient, relevant documentation for review, and (2) meeting with the Director for a comprehensive eligibility and access planning meeting (a.k.a., an intake.) It is not meant to be an onerous process, but **IT TAKES TIME**. Therefore:

- Students are urged to contact DRP at disabilityresourceprogram@uchastings.edu or 415-581-8948 at the very beginning of the semester to initiate this process and for timely consideration of classroom-based accommodations. Students are advised to schedule an intake appointment **by FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 9, 2016**, in order to be considered “timely” for classroom-based accommodations, and in order to be **COMPLETE the registration process by FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 30, 2016**
- Accommodations are not granted retroactively, so earlier is better!
- The deadline for **COMPLETING** your registration with DRP to consider accommodations **for final exams is FRIDAY, OCTOBER 28, 2016**. However, **if you haven't begun the process well in advance of that date, you may be too late to receive accommodations for final exams**. Please refer to our website for more information about [registering with DRP](#).

Are you concerned that you might have a disability, but do not have current or sufficient documentation, or have never been tested?

If you have UC SHIP, your first step is to contact [Student Health Services](#) (SHS) for an evaluation and possible recommendation for further assessment. We recommend that you also contact DRP to schedule a consultation simultaneously. - [The Legal Aid Association of California](#) is recruiting volunteers to participate in their **LiveChat** through [LawHelpCA.org](#). This is the official statewide resource for self-help referrals and information and LiveChat volunteers help people navigate the website by providing direct, person-to-person help for someone who might be in a stressful and alienating legal situation who just needs a kind, human response. This is a great opportunity for anyone who is interested

in direct services, broadening access to justice, and community education. Students can gain pro bono hours and learn about tools for social justice in many topics. It is possible to work remotely from a personal computer, though the first few training/practice sessions take place in LAAC's Oakland office until you are comfortable navigating the website. This opportunity is open to 1L, 2L, or 3L volunteers. Students will assist low-income debtors with preparing answers and asserting defenses to third party debt collectors, protecting exempt income from garnishment, preparing discovery, disputing items on credit report, stopping debt collection harassment, and other consumer law issues. **The training session will take place on September 14th, from 5-7pm** at the San Francisco office located at 1035 Market St, 6th Floor. - **[The GI Rights Network](#)** and the **[Bay Area Military Law Panel](#)** invite you to a training session to volunteer with the GI Rights Hotline for the fall semester. **Training will take place on September 23rd, 2-5pm**, at the SF Quaker Meetinghouse at 65 9th Street in San Francisco. The GI Rights Network is coalition of nonprofit, nongovernmental organizations that provide free and confidential information to US military service members, veterans, and their families. Most of the work of the Network is done through the GI Rights Hotline, but the Network also provides email counseling and live in-person counseling in some locales. The Network also maintains a website with easy access to information about discharges, military regulations, GI rights, and other organizations; all information is available in both English and Spanish. The GI Rights Hotline asks students for a two hour a week commitment. Working hours are between 10 and 5 generally, although exceptions have been made. After attending a training session, students are paired with an experienced counselor until they have acquired command of the necessary materials, then they may counsel on their own. This is a great opportunity to be introduced to Military issues, and to work on your interviewing skills! - **[Justice & Diversity Center's Consumer Debt Defense and Education Clinic](#)** is a monthly clinic held two Wednesday evenings a month from 6-9pm. Volunteers assist attorneys with drafting cease and desist letters to creditors, answers, fee waiver applications, responses to discovery, motions for summary judgement, demands for bills of particulars, claims of exemption, proposed orders and proof of services. Volunteers also perform legal research on-site as needed to help manage the clinic and communications with clients. Volunteers will be likely to sit in on client consultations and as the clinic develops, volunteers maybe able to attend hearings and/or trials with attorneys. All volunteers must attend a 1-hour training session prior to volunteering. **For information about the next training, please email probono@sfbbar.org.**
- **[Justice & Diversity Center](#)** also hosts the **Interpreter Project**. Volunteers who are bilingual in English and either Spanish, Mandarin, or Cantonese are needed to assist with full scope cases that are placed with monolingual clients and attorneys. - **[Tenants Together](#)**, California's only statewide organization for renters' rights, is putting out a call for volunteers. In November of this year, five cities in the wider Bay Area will be voting on comprehensive rent control measures, and hopefully they will win. Volunteers will do work varying from supporting/defending legal challenges on rent control, helping prepare educational materials to train tenant lawyers on the new ordinances, compiling know-your-rights info sheets for affected tenants, and doing legal research. As we have seen in SF and Oakland (amongst many other cities), the appalling impacts of displacement more intensely affect people of color and low-income communities. In short, legal volunteers are key in the fight against gentrification and displacement. Volunteers are expected to commit to at least 5 hours per week. The Tenants Together office is located at 474 Valencia Street in San Francisco (a short walk from the

16th Street Mission BART station), open Monday-Friday 9am-5pm, and monthly clinics in Concord, Richmond, and San Jose are in the evenings. **To apply, please send a resume and cover letter to sara@tenantstogether.org.**
