This examination consists of three essay questions and 24 multiple choice questions. Read each question in its entirety before you start answering. Credit for your answers will be weighted in grading basically according to the following recommended time allocations:

Essay Question I: 60 minutes  
Essay Question II: 50 minutes  
Essay Question III: 40 minutes  
24 multiple choice questions: 60 minutes (2.5 minutes per question)

**BUDGET YOUR TIME.** The above recommended time allocations total 3 hours, 30 minutes. You are allowed 30 extra minutes to read through the questions and plan your answers.

Essay questions: In analyzing the essay questions, please address each issue reasonably raised by the facts -- whether or not you are told it was raised by the parties -- even if rendered moot by your analysis of some other issue. Remember that this is an examination in civil procedure; although issues addressed in other courses (such as contracts or torts) may provide useful background, extended discussions of other subjects will not receive credit. Credit for essay answers can be given only for analysis that is set forth in your answer; unexplained conclusions will not suffice. If you find it necessary to make a factual assumption, state your assumption and continue with your

answer. Good organization and clear expression will be rewarded in grading.

Multiple choice questions: Each multiple choice question is equally weighted. Select only one answer to each question. Pick the "best" answer from among the four options. Enter your answer on the scantron sheet; answers written on the exam itself will not be counted. For each multiple choice question assume the case is in federal court unless the question states otherwise.
