1. This exam consists of two parts. Part I consists of sixteen (16) multiple-choice questions, worth approximately 1/3 of your total exam grade. Part II consists of two essay questions, collectively worth the remaining 2/3 of your exam grade.

You are free to divide your time as you wish. **I suggest you spend approximately sixty (60) minutes on Part I, fifty (50) minutes on Part II.A, and ninety (90) minutes on Part II.B.** Note that the second essay question, Part II.B, has substantially more issues than Part II.A. I suggest you plan your time accordingly.
3. For Part I, choose the *best* of the four available answers. Only correct answers will receive credit.
4. For Part II, read each problem carefully and discuss each issue within our course of study that is reasonably raised by the facts. If you believe there is an ambiguity, error, inconsistency, or omission in the question, state your assumption about that ambiguity, error, inconsistency or omission in your discussion of the relevant issue.
5. You should assume that general contract law rules and principles apply (that is, the Restatement and UCC Article II), rather than those of a particular state jurisdiction. Any jurisdictions mentioned on this exam are fictional.
6. **Please be very careful not to write anything in any response that might personally identify you, in order to preserve the integrity of the exam and grading process.**
