For the multiple choice problems, you should read each problem carefully with particular regard for the question at the end of the problem. Then choose the best answer to the question posed. Record your answer on the scantron answer sheet provided. For the essay problem, discuss each issue within our course of study that is reasonably raised by the facts.
3. You may allocate your time as you wish. I would suggest that you devote about two hours to Part I, the multiple choice problems, about seventy-five minutes to Part II, the essay problem, and about fifteen minutes to review your answers.
4. You should assume that the uniform version of the Uniform Commercial Code is in effect despite any reference to a particular city or state.
5. You should assume that any foreign country mentioned in the examination is a party to the UN Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods (CISG) without any reservations.
