Grand Theft From Auto Hyde / McAllister Street

On Sunday, May 25, 2014 at approximately 4:30 pm, It was reported to UC Hastings Public Safety Department that a theft from a vehicle had occurred near the intersection of Hyde and McAllister Street. The victim a member of the Hastings community stated that they parked their vehicle at 2:30 pm and returned at 4:30 pm to find that their luggage and personal property items valued at \$6,000.00 had been stolen from the vehicle. There were no visible signs of forced entry to the vehicle. Hastings surveillance footage of the area captured the incident.

Suspect Description:

White male adult, mid 30's, 5'10, 185lbs, orange sun hat, red shirt, blue sweatshirt, khaki pants, black backpack, carrying an orange bag with brown leather straps.
