Theft from Auto 200-250 McAllister Street

On Tuesday, June 24, 2014 at approximately 10:00 am, it was reported to UC Hastings Public Safety Department that a theft from a vehicle had occurred on the 200-250 block of McAllister Street. The victim a member of the public stated that they parked their vehicle at 12:51 am and returned at 10:00 am to find that two cell phones valued at \$400.00 had been stolen from the vehicle. There were visible signs of forced entry (broken window) to the vehicle. Hastings surveillance footage of the area captured limited footage of the incident at approximately 2:27 am. The victim was advised to file a San Francisco Police Report.

Suspect Description:

Black male adult, black hooded sweatshirt with white colored design on front, and dark pants.
