Aggravated Assault w/Knife Hyde Street / Golden Gate Avenue

On Tuesday, April 29, 2014 at approximately 9:55 am, it was reported to Hastings Public Safety Department that an aggravated assault with a knife occurred at the intersection of Hyde Street and Golden Gate Avenue. It was reported that an unknown suspect stabbed an unknown male victim in the back with a knife near the intersection of Hyde Street and Golden Gate Avenue. The victim indicated that he was intervening in a fight he observed between the suspect and another unknown subject. The suspect was then taken into custody by Federal Protective Service Police Officers. The victim was transported to a nearby hospital.

The suspect was described as an unknown black male adult, the victim was described an unknown white male adult.

Personal Safety Tips

- If a weapon is displayed, don't resist. Give up your property and save your life.
- Do what you are told and don't make any sudden moves.
- Try to remember as many details as possible and alert Public Safety or the Police as soon as possible.
- Your goal should be to escape safely and survive; cooperate if you think that resisting may lead to further harm.
- Remember every situation is different; you are the only one who can decide the appropriate course of action.

If you are the victim of a crime in the area of Hastings, please report it to Hastings Public Safety Department, and to San Francisco Police Department to file reports.

If you observe any suspicious activity on or around campus please report it to Campus Public Safety immediately at 565-4611 or by picking up a "Red" phone, or once you are in a safe location. At the UC Hastings Garage there are assistance stations that can be used to contact Campus Public Safety as well. For emergency or in-progress incidents, dial 9-1-1 and/or report it to the Public Safety Department.
