# CRIME ALERT

*May 19, 2013*  
*Theft From Locked Vehicle*  
*Hyde/Golden Gate Ave Intersection*

On Sunday, May 19, 2013, at approximately 1:57 am, it was observed by a Hastings Public Safety Officer on surveillance camera, two undercover ABC officers investigating an auto burglary with one subject detained on the southwest intersection of Golden Gate Avenue at Hyde Street. After reviewing surveillance footage, it shows an unknown black male adult wearing beige colored jacket and dark colored pants breaking the right rear window of the vehicle. The unknown subject grabbed a black backpack with pink trim and "SF" on the bag. Inside the bag was school supplies and books. The unknown suspect then fled northbound on Hyde Street. Another suspect, hispanic male adult was seen taking a red duffel bag and was later arrested.

Surveillance review of the area was limited but revealed the incident took place at approximately 1:41am.

**Vehicle Description:**

Purple Jeep Grand Cherokee

**Suspect Description:**

Suspect #1: black male adult wearing beige colored jacket and dark colored pants

Suspect #2: hispanic male adult (taken into custody)
