211 PC Robbery w/Force – 50 Hyde Street

On Wednesday, June 12, 2013 at approximately 11:56 am, a UC Hastings employee reported to the Department of Public Safety that he just observed two female subjects that were members of the public screaming for help in a doorway located on Hyde Street. He confirmed that a cellular phone was stolen by an unknown suspect that was fleeing northbound on Hyde Street. A Public Safety officer pursued the suspect in the area reported, contacted SFPD and canvassed the area, but was met with negative results. SFPD additionally tracked the phone to Market Street but the tracking signal was lost.

The victim stated that the suspect cornered the victim in a doorway and forcefully took the phone from the victim's hands.

The victim described the suspect(s) with the following information:

Suspect Description:

Black male adult wearing black hooded sweatshirt, dark denim pants, and black ballcap with a white colored design on the front of it.

Surveillance footage was able to capture limited footage of the incident, the suspect is observed fleeing northbound on Hyde Street.

Currently, robbery of cellular phones on the street in San Francisco is a growing crime.
