Aggravated Assault w/Knife – Leavenworth Street and McAllister Street

On Monday, June 17, 2013 at approximately 4:04pm, Hastings Public Safety responded to a report of a fight on the corner of Leavenworth Street and McAllister Street. The victim was walking south on Leavenworth when a group of individuals confronted him. Suspects began to yell at victim. One of the suspects brandished a knife toward the victim. The victim fled south on Leavenworth and continued west into the middle of the street in front of 100 McAllister Street. The victim was pushed and fell to the ground, lacerating his right palm. While the victim was on the ground, two suspects began kicking and hitting the victim on the head and body until Hastings Public Safety Officers arrived at the location. Suspects noticed Hastings Officers running toward them so they fled the area. Two of the suspects ran into 50 UN Plaza then separated, the other suspect continued along McAllister to 7th Street. Victim knows the suspects from his apartment complex.

Surveillance cameras captured limited footage of the incident. The suspects are observed fleeing into 50 UN Plaza and McAllister Street to 7th Street.

The victim described the suspects with the following information: The suspects were described as two Asia male adults and one female adult, 20-30 years old.
