# CRIME ALERT

*March 10, 2013*

## *Vandalism / Theft From Vehicle 300 block of Golden Gate Avenue*

On Sunday, March 10, 2013, at approximately 0149 hours, A UC Hastings Public Safety Officer observed the victim cleaning broken glass from their vehicle on the 300 block of Golden Gate Avenue. The vehicle window was broken and several items were missing. After reviewing surveillance footage, it shows an unknown black male adult breaking into the vehicle at approximately 0138 hours. The unknown subject then fled northbound on Hyde Street.

### **Vehicle Descriptions:**

Black BMW 325i

### **Suspect Description:**

Suspect #1: A black male adult, black beanie black jacket, and black pants.

Surveillance video footage captured images of the subjects vandalizing the vehicle.

### **Auto Burglary Prevention Tips**

Many auto-burglaries are "crimes of opportunity"; that could have been avoided had some of the following simple preventative steps been taken.

- Lock all of your vehicle's doors
- Set alarm or anti-theft device
- Don't leave valuables in the car
- If you must leave valuable items in your car while out and about, place items out of sight before reaching your destination or move them inconspicuously

At the UC Hastings Garage there are assistance stations that can be used to contact Campus Public Safety as well. For emergency or in-progress incidents, dial 9-1-1 and/or report it to the Public Safety Department.
