- A signed copy of the tryout agreement, included on page 3 of this application; and
- TA reference sheet, included on page 4 (submit to your TA).

In addition to this application, you are required to argue before a panel of current Hastings Moot Court Team members. This tryout consists of a 5-minute oral argument based on competition problems from the 2017-18 academic year, as well as a brief interview following your argument. Tryouts will be held April 9-12. Tryout sign-up sheets are posted on the Fourth Floor outside of Room 431 in Snodgrass Hall. You may sign up for a tryout time upon submitting a complete application packet. Make sure to note your tryout day and time on the top of this form.

ALL APPLICATIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE MOOT COURT DEPARTMENT NO LATER THAN 4 P.M. ON WEDNESDAY, APRIL 4, 2018. This deadline is firm. There are no exceptions for late applications unless prior permission is obtained from Toni Young, Sr. Assistant Dean of LW&R and Moot Court.

You will receive a phone call regarding the results. All new team members will receive invitations to attend the Moot Court Awards Ceremony on Wednesday, April 18, 2018, when the teams will be announced.
