**2003-04 SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION**

**DEADLINE: Postmarked or submitted by MONDAY March 17, 2003 5:00 P.M.**

**Applications submitted after this deadline will be returned to the applicant and not considered.**

**Introduction**

The scholarship program at Hastings College, coordinated by the Director of Financial Aid, is designed to recognize and encourage the achievement, creativity and potential of Hastings students. The College offers a variety of scholarship opportunities for continuing students. This application is for scholarships that will be awarded for the 2003-04 academic year. Students who are currently 1L or 2L and will be 2L & 3L in 2003-04 are eligible to apply. 2L and 3L designations herein refer to grade level during the 2003-04 academic year.

Restricted scholarship funds are given by donors and are available annually to students who meet specific criterion such as financial need, academic achievement and/or demonstrated service to the college and the community at large.

**Scholarships and Study Away (domestic programs), Study Abroad (international programs), or Leave of Absence**

Students who plan to study away/abroad or take a Leave of absence (LOA) in either the fall 2003 or spring 2004 semester are eligible to apply for these donor named scholarships. Students must be enrolled at Hastings to receive a scholarship. Therefore, in the event a student is selected to receive a scholarship and studies away/abroad or takes a LOA for one semester, s/he will receive the full scholarship in the semester s/he attends Hastings. If s/he studies away/abroad or takes a LOA both semesters the scholarship will be forfeited.

**Procedure**

Current 1L and 2L students may apply for any number of scholarships by checking the appropriate box(es) on this application. Be sure to read the scholarship criteria carefully and supply the information needed for consideration. **Submit THREE COPIES of this application and supporting information (i.e., biographical statement, resume, special essay) by the deadline, 5:00 p.m., Monday, March 17, 2003.**

**As with exams, please do not put your name or any other identifying items on your resume, essay, biographical profile or anything else you submit with the application. Instead, please put your student ID# on all items. We will delete your name from your transcript. This procedure will ensure confidentiality and fairness in the evaluation process.**

## **GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION**

- On the following pages is a list of restricted scholarships available through the College, including a brief description of the scholarship and eligibility criteria.
- To further assist you in determining whether you meet certain eligibility criteria, the following definitions are offered:

Deserving and/or Worthy: Four factors are considered: (You do not have to meet all four criterion in order to apply.)

1. Academic achievement (top 1/3 of the class preferred).
2. Evidence the applicant has overcome hardship.
3. Evidence of volunteer service by the applicant to Hastings.
4. Evidence of volunteer service by the applicant to the community.

Financial Need or Needy Students: Applicants must have submitted a 2003-04 FAFSA form and be found eligible for federal financial aid for the 2003-04 academic year.

- Amounts awarded from each scholarship are based on funding availability and may vary from year to year. Amounts generally range from \$1,000 to \$5,000.
- Due to the limited number of scholarships available and the large pool of eligible candidates, the Scholarship Selection Committee will avoid awarding a student more than one scholarship in a given year. Should an applicant receive an award based on pure academic achievement this will not preclude the applicant from receiving another scholarship.
- Under current IRS regulations, scholarships may be subject to income tax in the year received.
- By Federal regulation, students on financial aid may not receive aid in excess of their eligibility. Therefore, receipt of a scholarship may result in an adjustment to the student's financial aid package. Any reduction required will be made to loans first.
- Each scholarship is subject to annual funding availability.
- Scholarship recipients and donors will be honored at the College's annual Scholarship Tea that will be held in April 2004.
- Recipients will be notified in Fall 2003.

## **APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS**

- If you meet the eligibility criteria and wish to apply for a scholarship, **submit THREE COPIES of the scholarship application and supporting documents (a one to two page biographical statement, a resume, and a separate essay, if required) to the Hastings College Financial Aid Office no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, March 17, 2003.**
- In your biographical statement, be sure to address all the eligibility criteria listed under each scholarship for which you are applying. This information is essential for the selection committee in considering your application. When addressing hardships overcome, please be positive and don't dwell on the negative.

- W. Ray Forrester Scholarship** *Established in memory of W. Ray Forester, who served with great distinction as a member of the Hastings 65 Club faculty from 1976 to 2001. Awarded to a deserving 2L or 3L who qualifies for financial aid.*
- Harry H. and Lillian H. Hastings Scholarship** *Recipients are selected based on excellent academic grade point average as well as financial need.*

- Richard Earl Denham Scholarship** *Established in honor of Richard Earl Denham, a Hastings alumnus, as a grant toward tuition and fees. Recipient is selected on basis of financial need and scholastic ability/achievement.*
- Mark Feldman Memorial Scholarship** *Awarded to students who are in need of financial assistance.*
- Ingemar E. Hoberg Memorial Scholarship** *Established in honor of a Hastings alumnus and former member of the Board of Directors. Awarded to students who have met and overcome personal and financial hardships. (Explain in biographical statement)*
- The John T. Knox Scholarship** *Awarded to a needy student who has lived in the city of Richmond, California for a period of five years between the ages of ten and eighteen. Do you meet this criteria?     No     Yes. (Supply supporting documentation)*
- Bernard and Joan Maier Memorial Scholarship** *Established by Hastings Professor Peter Maier in memory of his parents. Awarded to financially needy students who are immigrants or children of immigrants or who are from economically or culturally deprived backgrounds. Do you meet this criteria?     No     Yes. - Robert McGrath Scholarship** *Awarded to a 2L or 3L who demonstrates financial need.*
- John Bell Mhoon Scholarship** *Awarded to needy students.*

**Arthur and Eugenia Sammis Memorial** *Established in memory of a former Dean of the College and his wife. Awarded to financially needy students.*

**Sheffield Sanborn Scholarship** *Established in memory of Mr. Sanborn, an alumnus of the Class of 1894. Awarded to aid worthy students.*

**Percy C. Towne Scholarship** *Awarded to worthy, but economically disadvantaged students.*

**Bergen and Cecile Van Brunt Scholarship** *Awarded to needy students.*

### SECTION III: SPECIAL CRITERIA SCHOLARSHIPS

**Paul and Margaret Basye Scholarship** *Established by Hastings emeritus Professor Paul Bayse and his wife Margaret. Awarded to financially needy students admitted through general admissions procedures. Academic achievement required. Second year students need to be in the top quarter of their class. Third year students need to be in the top third of their class.*

**The Louis and Rachel Bauer Scholarship** *Established by Stanley L. Bauer, a 1951 Hastings graduate and distinguished tax law practitioner in memory of his parents, Louis and Rachel Bauer. Two scholarships: one to a 2L or 3L male and the other to a 2L or 3L female who demonstrates scholarship, financial need, and characteristics and qualities deemed desirable for an attorney.*

**Class of 1966 Scholarship** *Established by Hastings' Class of 1966. Awarded to a third year student who ranked in the top 30 students of the class at the end of the second year. Must qualify for financial aid and have demonstrated leadership qualities as evidenced by having performed volunteer service to the College or the community at large while at Hastings.*

**Class of 1969 Scholarship** *Established by Hastings' Class of 1969. Awarded to a second or third year student who is in the top third of his or her class; who qualifies for financial aid; and demonstrates leadership qualities as evidenced by having performed volunteer service to the College or the community at large while at Hastings. (Give detail in biographical statement.)*

**Ellison & Schneider Environmental Law Scholarship** *A \$3000 scholarship is awarded to a 2002-03 second year LEOP student enrolled in eligible environmental law related courses. The recipient must also agree to enroll in at least one environmental law related course each semester of his/her third year. In return, the recipient will be awarded \$1500 each semester of the third year. An additional application is required and will be issued to each applicant.*

**The Girard and Green Scholarship** *Established by Prof. David Levine to honor the Girard and Green Law Firm this scholarship is awarded to a deserving student who has graduated from a Bay Area public high school. Preference is given to graduates of public high schools in San Francisco.*

**Name of high school city and county:**

**The Roger and Suzanne Park Scholarship** *Awarded to a 2003-04 second or third year student who ranks in the top 50% of the class at the end of 2002-03 and qualifies for financial aid.*

**San Francisco Legal Auxiliary** *Established by the San Francisco Legal Auxiliary. Awarded to a deserving second or third year student who is a graduate of a Bay Area high school. Preference given to female students.*

**Name of high school city and county:**

**Class of 1970 Scholarship** *Established by Hastings' Class of 1970. Awarded to a 2003-04 second or third year student in the top third of his or her class at the end of 2002-03 who qualifies for financial aid.*

**Allen D. Wilson Memorial Scholarship** *Established in memory of Allen D. Wilson. Awarded to needy students who are of good moral character and profess a belief in God. (Give detail in biographical statement.)*

**SECTION IV: ESSAY SCHOLARSHIPS** Three scholarships require typewritten essays as part of the application process. Below are the scholarships, essay topics and other pertinent information. For each scholarship, the faculty Scholarship Selection Committee will read all applications and select a pre-determined number of finalists. Off-campus selection committees established for each scholarship will select the recipient from the finalists.

**Mildred W. Levin Scholarship** *Established in honor of the Hastings alumna. Awarded to deserving second or third year students demonstrating financial need. Recipients are selected by the Queen's Bench of San Francisco. A detailed resume and typewritten essay must be submitted.*

**Essay topic:** "What experience or event in your life motivated or directed you to pursue a career in law?"

**Length of essay:** Not more than two typewritten pages

**Number of finalists:** Up to eight. Finalists will be invited to an interview with the selection committee

**Award amount:** \$500 - \$1500

**Justice Wiley W. Manuel Scholarship** *Established in honor of the Hastings alumnus, former Assistant Attorney General and Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of California. Awarded to a second year student demonstrating financial need, academic achievement and community involvement. A typewritten essay must be submitted.*

**Essay topic:** Applicants must submit a concise and well organized statement outlining their background, current interests, community involvement and career goals after graduation from Hastings. Married students, students with children and ethnic students are encouraged to apply.

**Length of essay:** Not more than three typewritten pages

**Number of finalists:** Up to six **Award amount:** \$2,000

- George R. Moscone Scholarship** *Established in honor of the Hastings alumnus and former Mayor of San Francisco to promote his ideals of public service. Awarded to a second or third year student demonstrating financial need and academic achievement. A typewritten essay must be submitted.*

**Essay topic:** Please contact the Financial Aid Office for specific essay information.

**Length of essay:** Approximately 2,000 typewritten words

**Number of finalists:** Up to twelve

**Award amount:** Approximately \$3,000
