On the right-hand side, under Admissions, click on Registration to print out the "Law Student Registration Form and Instructions for Registration."

HASTINGS STUDENT COMPUTER SUPPORT POLICY

The Hastings IT Department provides limited computer support services for students at our weekly drop-in support session. We hold these sessions every **Wednesday, from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m., Room 354A, 200 Bldg.** We also have a limited number of appointments during the week, if you cannot make the drop-in session. Please call 581-8802 for an appointment (available on a first-call, first-served basis).

What we offer: help with installation

and troubleshooting of E-mail software, computer exam software, wired and wireless networking, and antivirus protection. Students who request IT Department staff to assist with any of the above range of problems will be asked to sign a Waiver of Responsibility before any such work is begun. For any problems outside the scope of work that the IT Department can provide, or for any students who decline to sign the Waiver of Responsibility, the IT Department will make referrals to local vendors who provide computer repair services.

WIRELESS INTERNET ACCESS

We have wireless Internet accessible in all student-accessible areas in the 198 and 200 McAllister buildings. We also now have "WiFi" accessible on most residential floors in the 100 Tower, including the Skyroom. If you need help getting wireless installed, come to one of our student drop-in sessions (see above).

PHYSICAL EXAMS AND TB TESTS

First year students who have not completed their physical examination forms should do so as soon as possible. Student Health Services has the names of local clinics that will perform a comparatively low-cost physical exam. Incoming students who have not had a TB skin test in the last six months, check with Student

Health Services about getting the test done during orientation.

INSURANCE CLAIM FORMS

Students who needed medical care during the summer may pick up claim forms in the Student Health office. Remember: You must file a claim form for each illness or accident. The new policy year began on **August 19, 2004.** Ongoing referrals need to be rewritten for this policy year.

INSURANCE BROCHURES AND INSURANCE CARDS

Insurance policy brochures for students purchasing Hastings insurance have been placed in your SIC folders effective **August 18.** The paper card on the back of the brochure may be used as a temporary card until permanent cards are received in September. Continuing students can use their Express Scripts card from last year and will not receive a new one. New students who need to fill a prescription before their cards become available may get a temporary card from the Student Health Office.

MEDICAL REFERRALS

Students with Hastings insurance who are still receiving medical care that was started during the summer, or continued from last year, need to come by Student Health for a referral for continuing that care beginning **August 19, 2004.**

Scholarship Notices

J. L. Turner Legal Association: J.L. Turner, an association of African-American attorneys in Dallas, Texas, established its need-based scholarship to provide financial assistance to law students who have a connection to the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex.
