

JOHN L. GEDID

Professor John L. Gedid is Director of the Law & Government Institute, which he founded, at Widener University School of Law's Harrisburg Campus. He was the founding dean of Widener Law School's Harrisburg Branch. Prior to joining Widener, Professor Gedid taught at Duquesne Law School, where he also served as Dean in the early 1980's. Professor Gedid is Official Reporter of Decisions of the Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania. He was elected to membership in the American Law Institute in 1983. He serves as a Pennsylvania commissioner to the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws, where he is involved in the current project to revise the Model State Administrative Procedure Act. He serves as consultant to the Pennsylvania Governor's Office of General Counsel on administrative law matters. He served for many years on the Pennsylvania Supreme Court Civil Procedure Rules Committee. Professor Gedid is past chair of the Pennsylvania Bar Association Administrative Law Section and Editor of the Pennsylvania Bar Association Administrative Law Journal.

Professor Gedid received his B.A., *summa cum laude*, from the University of Pittsburgh, where he was also elected to membership in *Phi Beta Kappa*; his J.D. from Duquesne Law School, where he served as comment editor of the *Duquesne Law Review*; and his LL.M from Yale Law School. He teaches Administrative Law, Pennsylvania Administrative Law, Contracts, Sales, Conflicts, and State Constitutional Law. He has published extensively in the area of procedural due process.
