

M. DAVID GELFAND

Professor M. David Gelfand holds the Ashton Phelps Chair of Constitutional Law at Tulane Law School in New Orleans, Louisiana. He was educated at Columbia College, Columbia Law School, and Oxford University.

Professor Gelfand has written several books, including *Suing and Defending Cities for Federal Constitutional Violations: A Treatise for City Attorneys and Public Interest Litigators* (LexisNexis 3d ed. 2001 & semi-annual supplements). He is the coauthor of *State and Local Taxation and Finance in a Nutshell* (West 2d ed. 2000), and the Editor and contributing author of a three-volume treatise entitled *State and Local Government Debt Financing* (West Group 1991 & annual supplements and revisions). He has also authored dozens of articles on constitutional law, voting rights, British intergovernmental relations, and state and local government finance.

In 1987, Professor Gelfand was a Fulbright Senior Lecturer in Japan, and he returned to Japan and Korea in 1993 as a lecturer on Constitutional Law and local government. He has also lectured on similar subjects in Africa and Western Europe, and he later served as a constitutional advisor to various countries in Eastern Europe.

Professor Gelfand represented successful plaintiffs in the *Jefferson Parish*, *Westwego*, and *Gretna* voting rights cases, involving local governments, as well as amicus in the U.S. Supreme Court's *Chisom* case, involving the Louisiana Supreme Court. In a more objective role, he served as Special Master, drawing the local government districts for Washington Parish, Louisiana and for Dade County, Florida. As the court-appointed independent expert, he prepared Florida's Congressional districts in 1992.

Professor Gelfand was lead consultant on voting rights issues to the New York City Charter Revision Commission (1987-89). He served as a member of the New Orleans City Planning Commission (1986-88), and subsequently (for many years) he represented the New Orleans City Council and various City agencies in negotiations and litigation regarding civil rights issues. Professor Gelfand has testified in federal and state courts (including California) as an Expert Witness on land use and exclusionary zoning issues, civil rights and civil liberties, the

value of legal services, powers and fiduciary duties of local government officials, and municipal finance.

Professor Gelfand has litigated dozens of civil rights and civil liberties cases at all levels of the federal court system and in several state courts (Florida, Louisiana, New York, and Washington). He is a member of the New York and Florida bars.
