

Bylaws of the Hastings Cycling League Organization

Article I – Name of Organization

The name of our organization is the Hastings Cycling League.

Article II - Purpose

The purpose of the Hastings Cycling League is to represent the student body at Hastings College of the Law who are members of the cycling community, to inform cyclists of their legal rights and responsibilities, to raise awareness of the legal issues cyclists encounter in the judicial system, and to promote cycling as a recreational, athletic, and cultural activity.

Article III – Membership

Membership to our organization is restricted to full-time students at Hastings. We will not impose any dues or fees to be a member of our organization. We will not require ownership of a bicycle to be a member of organization, but we will encourage our members to have access to one to be able to fully participate in our activities and events.

Article IV– Officers

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall consist of a president, internal vice president/technical advisor, external vice president/technical advisor, and a treasurer.

Section 2. Only second and third year students who have held membership for a minimum of one academic semester are eligible to hold office or to head special committees.

Section 3. The method of nomination shall be from the floor by an active member. Officers of the organization shall be elected by secret ballot by the members to service for one academic year. Elections shall be held during the spring semester at the annual business meeting in April and all officers shall take office the following meeting after their election and shall remain in office until their successors are elected.

Section 4. If the office of the president should become vacant for any reason, the internal vice president shall fill that vacancy for the remainder of the term. If any office other than the president shall become vacant, that vacancy shall be filled by special election by the members for the remainder of the term.

Section 5. No member shall hold more than one office at a time, and no member shall be eligible to serve more than two consecutive terms in the same office.

Section 6. The officers shall perform duties prescribed by these bylaws and by the democratic authority adopted by the organization.

Article V – Meetings

Section 1. The regular meetings of the organization shall be held on the first Friday of each month from September to April unless otherwise ordered by the organization.

Section 2. The regular meeting on the first Friday in April shall be known as the annual meeting and shall be for the purpose of electing officers for the subsequent term.

Section 3. Special meetings can be called at the request of any of the officers. At least two days notice shall be given to all members.

Article VI – Amendment of Bylaws

These bylaws can be amended at any regular meeting or the organization by a two-thirds vote, provided that the amendment has been submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.
